Step 12: The Joy of Living

Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.


Each month this year, we've explored each of the steps in turn. Now, we're taking a look at the Twelfth Step in the twelfth month. The holidays can be full of excitement, promise, closeness, and . . . expectations. Not unlike sobriety itself.

In The Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, the very first line states that "The joy of living is the theme of AA's Twelfth Step, and action its key word." So let's set aside the twelfth month stuff for a moment: the anxiety of time spent with family, the pressures to be happy and jingly and spendy that can so easily lead to disappointment and resentment. Let's leave expectations behind and turn our attention to the Twelfth Step: the joys of sobriety, and the key word of action.

What kind of action are we talking about? The Big Book's tales of calling doctors and clergymen to track down new prospects seems a bit antiquated, but the idea behind it is still fresh. Carrying the message means showing up for each other to share our experience, strength, and hope. This issue is full of opportunities. From answering phones to balancing books to stacking chairs, when your actions support other alcoholics, you're giving, but you're also taking in the greatest gifts of sobriety. According to the 12 x 12:

"Service, gladly rendered, obligations squarely met, troubles well accepted or solved with God's help, the knowledge that at home or in the world outside we are partners in a common effort, the well-understood fact that in God's sight all human beings are important, the proof that love freely given surely brings a full return, the certainty that we are no longer isolated and alone in self-constructed prisons, the surety that we need no longer be square pegs in round holes but can fit and belong in God's scheme of things—these are the permanent and legitimate satisfactions of right living for which no amount of pomp and circumstance, no heap of material possessions, could possibly be substitutes."

As we look ahead to the New Year, let's turn our attention away from what we can gain from our sobriety and AA, and focus instead on the action that can yield "the new attitudes that finally brought many of us an inner strength and peace that could not be deeply shaken."

Volunteer for Daytime Phone Service Positions

You will receive a text on your personal phone from our answering service indicating the caller's name, phone number and reason for calling. You will be the front line of AA to reach out to the caller and share your experience, strength and hope around our program of recovery. Nine months of sobriety suggested.
